Parks turf transformation saves 1 million gallons of water

More than 1 million gallons of water a year is being saved by a City of West Sacramento program which converts grass turf into drought friendly landscaping. Over the past year, City Parks workers removed grass from several sites and replaced it with water conserving options including drought tolerant plants, bark groundcover, mulch and decomposed granite. The City also converted to more water efficient sprinkler systems or eliminated them entirely.

Appellate Court Upholds | Bridge District residents **Gang Injunction:**

Eight Members of West Sacramento's Broderick Boys Criminal Street Had Appealed the Trial Court's 2011 Judgment Granting an Injunction

California's Third District Court of Appeal has upheld an injunction issued by Yolo County Superior Court Judge Kathleen M. White against eight members of the Broderick Boys criminal street gang, Yolo County District Attorney Jeff Reisig announced on Tuesday. Feb. 28.

The injunction, which was issued by Judge White on June 16, 2011, prohibits active Broderick Boy gang members from engaging in certain public nuisance activities in a 2.98-square-mile area of West Sacramento. Pursuant to the order, active gang members are prohibited, among other things, from associating together in public, intimidating victims or witnesses, possessing guns or deadly weapons, damaging public or private property, using and/or selling drugs, violating a 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. curfew with limited exceptions, trespassing and violating other laws.

In its 77-page written opinion affirming the trial court's decision, the Court of Appeal found that the appellants, the gang members, had failed to establish any prejudicial error in the trial court. Moreover, the Appellate Court found that the appellants had misstated "facts and law" in their appeal and failed to comply with relevant rules of court.

In reaching its decision, the Appellate Court summarized evidence and crimes presented in the trial court, which included facts that established that the Broderick Boys is a criminal street gang in the northern part of West Sacramento, whose primary activities are assaults, firearms offenses, drug sales, vehicle theft and gang graffiti.

The Appellate Court also held that there was "plenty of evidence of appellants' active membership" in the Broderick Boys criminal street gang.

The California Attorney General's Office represented the People and defended the injunction in the Appellate Court proceedings. Unless modified, the court ordered gang injunction will expire in

raise concern over parking costs, availability at City Council meeting

Six West Sacramento Bridge District residents expressed concern to the city council on Wednesday, March 1 over rising costs, safety issues and availability of parking associated with new parking meters and a new parking lot the city plans to implement by May.

The council was presented with two options for pricing of the meters and parking permits for the district's first service parking lot by Chris Dougherty, transportation program specialist for the city and Paul Blumberg, West Sacramento public finance officer. The presentation was approved at the Feb. 15 city council meeting.

"One [option] just simply sets parking meter rates," Blumberg said during the presentation. "Our second option is to add a provision that would allow the establishment of a residential parking area. We think that there is a way we can allow folks who buy into the monthly lot also to park on street around their unit."


The current parking rate of \$1.75 an hour permits are set to expire March 31, but the new permit plan won't be in place until after April 15, so a 30-day extension was requested.

After consideration of public comments the and the presentation, the council voted to extend the permit expira-

tion date to April 30 and to discuss a third option that could integrate provisions for some more lighting, possible security patrols and to discuss lower rates for resident parking permits, all of which were brought up by the residents who spoke.

Under the proposal, meter rates will follow a structure similar to downtown Sacramento, beginning at a base and utilizing a tiered structure that will increase over time. Blumberg said this is to discourage people from parking at the meters for extended periods of time. Special rates will apply during high traf-

Completes transition from former name, Elderly Nutrition Program

Formerly known as the Elderly Nutrition Program, Meals on Wheels Yolo County has announced the final stage of their year-long branding transition, their new website. The site can be accessed at http://mowyolo.org. Christi Skibbins, Executive Director, said, "We have dropped the use of the old name, as our clients don't like being labeled "elderly", and the name doesn't really represent what we do as well as "Meals on Wheels" does. It tells our story in the most direct way possible, and provides instant understanding as to our mission and the region in which we work."

The new website provides site visitors an easy way to learn about the services that Meals on Wheels Yolo County provides and also allows the visitor to browse information based on their own choices. Clear and concise, the visitor can quickly access information on how to volunteer, eligibility requirements for seniors to participate in the meals program, sign up for an E-newsletter and more. Donations



to the non-profit organization can be made quickly and easily with a credit card or Apple Pay on the site, and access to their Facebook page is available right on the home page.

"A couple of years ago, as we were planning an update of name and logo, we couldn't decide the exact direction we wanted to take," said Skibbins. "But last year, Meals on Wheels America offered members an opportunity to adopt the national brand. This is a great solution for us, because when you see the national advertising campaigns, we will be recognized as part of a larger family."

The organization will continually update their content with helpful infor-

mation, articles, newsletters, announcements, client testimonials and more, and encourages site visitors to provide feedback and comments on the new site. Meals on Wheels Yolo County provides 350 hot meals every weekday to Yolo County seniors through two primary programs: Congregate Meals and Home Delivered Meals. All food is prepared from scratch at the central kitchen in Woodland, and delivered to nutrition sites at senior centers in Davis, West Sacramento, Winters, and Woodland...also to rural areas such as Esparto, Zamora and Knights Landing. Over 68 percent of the seniors served are very low income and 25 percent live below the poverty level. Additionally, the Weekend Food Project was begun in May 2015 and provides a bag of healthy, shelf stable groceries delivered to the neediest home delivery clients for the last weekend of each month. Having "run out of money before they have run out of month", these groceries help tide them over a difficult time.

fic times such as River Cats games or events at The Barn. Residents will be able to park anywhere they want after 10 p.m. when the meters are no longer functioning.

The biggest concern for most residents was the jump in price from \$10 a year for a parking permit to \$60 a month under the new propos-

"It feels odd to charge residents to park in a lot when there's so much parking available, especially when it's free in Sacramento," said Jessica Kriegel, a property owner in the bridge district.

"I wish that the council would consider changing the removal of the residential parking permits because I think that piece is what's not fitting well in this situation."

Another major concern was that residents weren't communicated with by the city or the planning organizations for these new parking changes. Blumberg outlined that community outreach would be a part of the plan after the rates are approved.

Security concerns were brought up by several of the residents who spoke.

"I work at Starbucks and I leave my apartment at three in the morning and walking to my car, if we have the lot on 5th and Bridge, me walking that distance in the dark, I don't think my husband

would be too fond of that," Joanne Maier said.

The \$60 per month permit cost for the new parking lot was another concern many of the speakers brought up. Maier said her husband is a truck driver who will be taking a pay cut soon with less work and that she's pregnant and will lose money while on maternity leave.

Another resident, Sean Tooke, explained that he is a student who commutes to San Francisco three or four days a week and leaves early in the morning. He said he is concerned about security, but is more concerned with the cost because he doesn't make much money as a student.

Many of the residents who spoke live in the new apartment complexes that have sprung up in recent years as part of the area's rapid expansion, but one couple spoke about living in a nearby house and how parking will be a concern for them once the new parking meters are up and running.

"We have given up the right to park in front of our street or even bring up groceries or anything," Mari Helmer said. "If I were to have work done in my house, just have the DirecTV guy come or the carpet guy come, my husband has to drive around through the whole Bridge District to see where we could park our car."

Helmer said parking lots should be included as part of the plan when the city decides to put in new businesses. She said The Barn should

have had its own parking lot and that the apartments should have had enough parking within the complexes to accommodate all of their residents.

She also raised concern over firefighters being able to get their trucks down the streets if they are filled with cars parked at the parking meters.

The council consisted of Mayor Pro Tem Mark Johannessen and council members Beverly Sandeen, Quirina Orozco and Christopher Ledesma. Mayor Christopher Cabaldon was not present. The city council will revisit the options for the parking meter rates and parking permit structure for residents at its next regularly-scheduled meeting on March 15.





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

Suicide prevention seeks crisis line volunteers

Suicide Prevention and Crisis Services of Yolo County (SPYC) will hold a five-week crisis line volunteer training beginning April 13.

Crisis line volunteers play a role in saving the lives of Yolo County residents; when they join the dedicated team of volunteers who answer the phones at SPYC, they become the first point of human contact in the steps toward mental health.

Volunteers undergo a 36-hour training program in which they develop the skills needed to address issues of depression, suicide, family relationship conflicts, and mental illness. Initially, volunteers commit to serving six hours per week with a one-year

service commitment upon successful completion of the training program. Volunteers have been, and continue to be, the backbone of SPYC. Quality training provides volunteers with the opportunity to participate in the increased well-being not only of themselves, but of those in their community.

SPYC will be interviewing prospective volunteers until April 7th. Those interested in applying are asked to please review the training dates listed below to ensure they will be able to attend each training date; there are no make-ups, and all potential volunteers are required to attend each training, on time. Applicants must also be at least 20 years old.
