OLG's Vacation Bible School. At church she serves as a lector and leads in the singing. Ana's great faith is uplifting to the other parishioners, especially to the moms and children.

Her generous contributions of her time and her talent are an inspiration to everyone.

She is also a member of the Sacramento Catholic Forum and serves on the Diocesan Council of Cath-

olic Women's Board.

Ana retired after 33 years with the State of California, with 10 years of service as a warden in the California prison system. She was one of the highest-ranking individuals in the California Department of Corrections. During that time she accepted challenges that few people would attempt.

She oversaw an acute care hospital program for the terminally ill in a 500-bed AIDS/HV unit. She ministered to the spiritual needs of patients while providing necessary physical care.

During a hostage crisis at a California facility, she saved the lives of a nurse and her unborn child. Ana received special recognition for leadership and bravery for her actions. She continues to be a model of courage, compassion and generosity.

She usually gives credit to others rather than accept it for herself. Ana Ramirez-Palmer attributes a significant amount of her successes to her husband, Steve Ramirez-Palmer and his loving support. Together they serve the Our Lady of Grace Parish.

Parking rates for the Bridge District still under consideration after hour-long March 15 meeting

After a lengthy discussion, the West Sacramento City Council unanimously approved three of seven changes proposed by Mayor Christopher Cabaldon in relation to the Bridge District parking rate resolution at its March 15 meeting.

The approved changes included pushing back the start date for the meter parking from May 1 to July 1 to allow more time for the decision-making process and to have city officials work with public transportation and bike share providers to assess transit improvements in areas where parking will be reduced.

Among the four proposed changes that were not adopted, Cabaldon suggested a tiered system where the parking rate for the new parking lot at 5th and Bridge—previously proposed at \$60 per month, a fee many residents were concerned about at the March 1 meeting of the council—to begin at \$30 for the first six months and then increase to \$50 per month for affordable housing residents in the district and to \$60 per month for all other residents.

Mayor Pro Tem Mark Johannessen suggested a similar system, but his version would have the fees start at \$30 for the first year and increase by \$10 each year until they reach \$60.

According to the staff report for the March 15 meeting, the lowest amount per parking space needed each month to recoup costs would be \$23.

According to the council, the proposed \$30 starting rate is high enough above that threshold, but would also help residents ease into the new pay structure.

With the \$60 rate, the additional \$37 would be to make up for parking vacancies and other costs associated with maintaining the parking lot over time, the report explained.

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A Day in the Life of A Hijab-Wearing Woman

Arooj Ahmad cultivates numerous identities. She is a stay-at-home mother of three; a daughter of Pakistani immigrants; a UC Davis graduate; a former labor organizer; and a West Sacramento community activist. Arooj currently serves on the Board of Directors at James Marshall Parent Participation Preschool. She has left her mark at the school, instigating a switch to sustainable cups and silverware for snack time and frequently takes leftover food to the homeless. Next, Arooj hopes to start a school garden at Westfield Elementary.

Among so many identities, there's one more: Arooj is a practicing Muslim. This identity is more visible than most, since she chooses to practice hijab - the wearing of a headscarf when she leaves her home. For many, hijab is a gesture of modesty, dignity, and an expression of faith. Arooj chose to start practicing hijab later in life, when she became a mom. To her, it is a way to show her children the importance of Islam in her life, in a visual way children can understand.

While she views wearing hijab as an act of spiritual devotion, Arooj is not immune to the fear of stigma. She has marked

a major difference in how others perceive her now, compared with her life before she wore hijab. She relates that her headscarf sometimes attracts ignorant, or even negative, attention from strangers. "People often assume I don't speak English... even though I was born in Lodi, [CA]!" laughs Arooj. Other encounters are less humorous. On a children's play date in McKinley Park with a friend, a homeless woman screamed at her group, "Go back to your own country!" Arooj admits it could be coincidence, but she seems to receive more than her fair share of getting cut in line, or road rage. One driver even stopped her car and pounded her fists on the window of Arooj's vehicle.

Perhaps the worst incident occurred when Arooj was buying diapers late at night in Stockton a few years ago. She remembers two women standing behind her in the checkout line. The women picked at her headscarf and repeatedly placed New Year Eve party hats on her head. They kept telling her, "We like these better [than your headscarf]!" The women continued to harass Arooj until management escorted them out of the store.

Arooj notes that for many Americans, the

hijab seems to serve as a marker of vulnerability. "But underneath the scarf, we're human!" she protests. She's aware that some Americans struggle to understand why a woman would "limit herself" by wearing hijab. Arooj relates a comparison made by Muslim activist Dalia Mogahed, that a woman in hijab

is basically "privatizing her sexuality." Arooj feels that ultimately, a certain degree of mutual tolerance is necessary in our diverse community, saying, "[Hijabis] don't ask that [others] understand all of the reasons why we choose to cover. But we do hope that people will be tolerant of our choice."

Residents in the area currently pay \$10 a year for parking, but under the new \$60 rate, that would increase to \$720 each year.

In addition, Cabaldon proposed an increase from 14 private street parking permits recommended for residents of The Habitat apartment complex, an affordable housing unit in the area, to 30 spaces to help ensure more residents would be able to park near their homes. Those permits would cost \$40 for the first year, and \$60 thereafter and Cabaldon added that 24 of them would be renewable after the first year once an assessment could be made regarding their necessity.

Another of the mayor's proposals was to change some language in the reso-

lution for clarity and the final proposal would establish parking meter codes that residents could give guests to allow them to park at a flat rate for up to 10 hours, twice per month.

Cabaldon said his set of proposals won't make everyone happy, but that it was the best way to try to balance concerns from residents, the needs of the city and the district's offerings to outside guests.

Concerns raised by residents at the March 1 meeting regarding temporary parking for loading or unloading vehicles were not addressed.

Cabaldon, who lives in the Bridge District, said that the district was planned to be a hybrid residential and commercial area from the start.

"This is an evolving issue," Cabaldon said. "This is the last [piece]. It's the adoption of the meter rates, it's not the overall parking program, which

we have already voted on repeatedly. Many of the policies that we've talked about have been adopted over the last year or prior to the construction of the district."

He clarified that residents should not be surprised by these changes and that they knew what they were signing up for when they moved to the district.

"This is not a unique place in the city, but close, in the sense that it is a new area that the entire city has contributed and envisioned creating for itself and for the community to take back the waterfront to create a lively, mixed-use, downtown-style district with lots of entertainment and food and design in it," Cabaldon said. "This isn't a quiet, existing residential neighborhood that's being disrupted by some external force, which is why we created residential permit parking in the first place."

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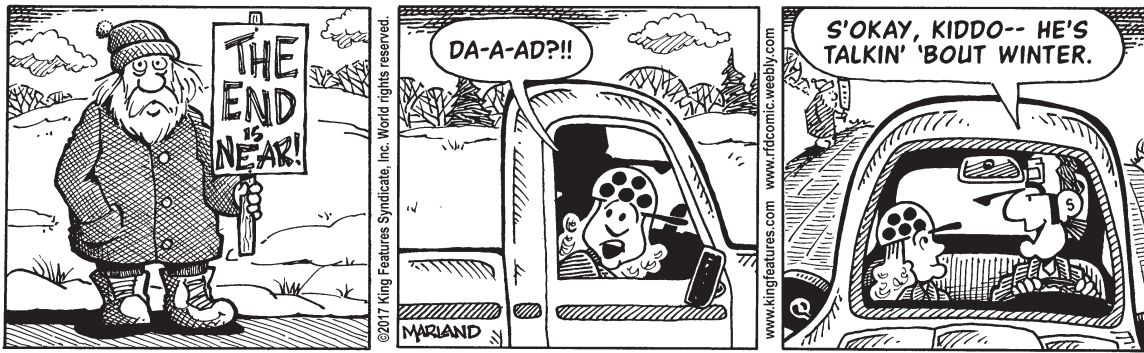

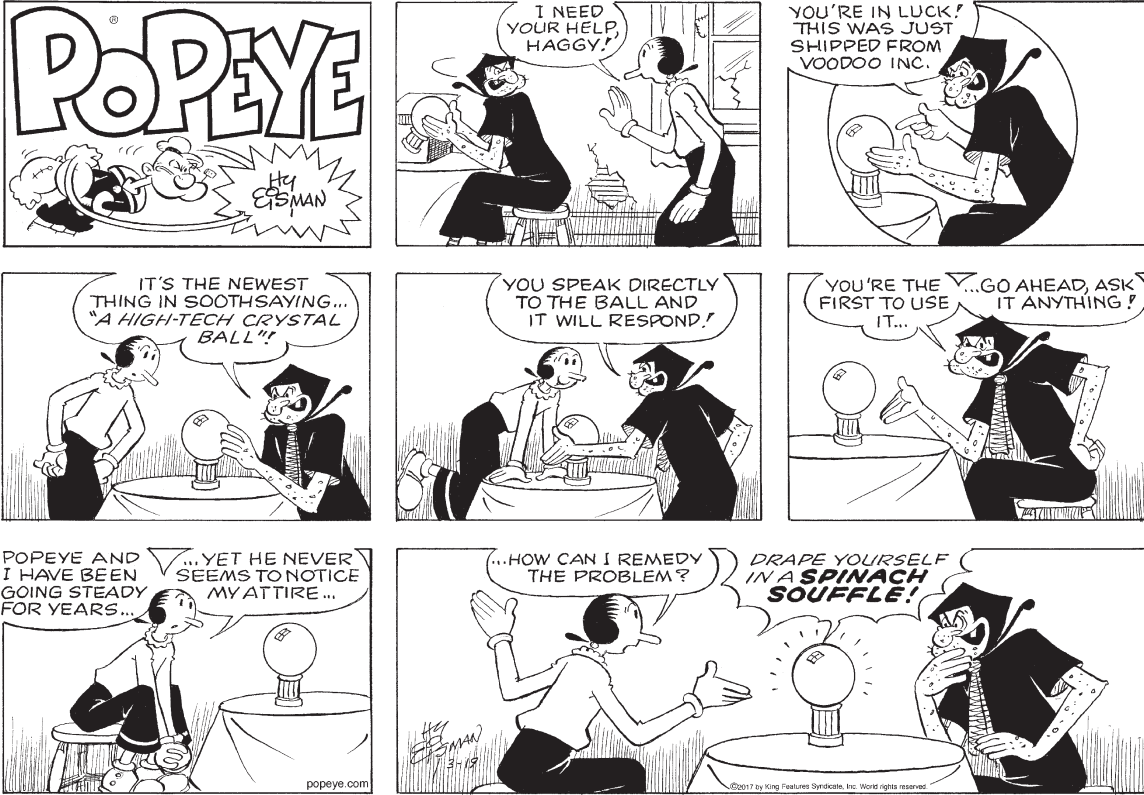

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FAQS regarding medical marijuana cultivation in Yolo County

Below are questions and answers concerning current Yolo County regulations related to the outdoor cultivation of medical marijuana in the unincorporated area of Yolo County with the intent to address neighbor complaints, limit harmful environmental impacts and protect patience access to medical marijuana.

Is the cultivation of medical marijuana permitted in Yolo County?

Cultivation of medical marijuana in Yolo County is currently allowed under the following conditions:

- For personal use - qualified patients (pursuant to Section 11362.5 of the Health & Safety Code). Requirements & Restrictions:
- The area of cultivation cannot exceed 100 square feet, at full plant maturity, per legal parcel.
- The 100 square feet limitation is imposed regardless of the number of qualified patients residing on the property, participating directly or indirectly in or benefiting from the cultivation.
- Cultivation is for personal medical use only; not for sale, distribution, donation or provision to any other person or entity.

For commercial cultivators by permit. Requirements & Restrictions:

Cultivation is allowed in compliance with Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (CVRWQCB) Order No. R5-2015-0113.

All cultivating by CVRWQCB permit shall provide the Yolo County Department of Agriculture a copy of a submitted Notice of Intent (to obtain regulatory coverage as a Tier 1, 2 or 3 cultivator, Monitoring Self-Certification and other documents demonstrating compliance) which must be complete and have been received with full payment by the CVRWQCB no later than 5:00 p.m. on October 11, 2016.

Garden canopy must be between 1,000 and 43,560 square feet; cultivation by permit of less

than 1,000 square feet is prohibited.

Must be a lessee of the property or, as of October 11, 2016 be the record owner of the property or have a fully executed sales and purchase agreement for the purchase of the property, on which the medical marijuana is cultivated, and for which the Notice of Intent with CVRWQCB was filed by October 11, 2016.

Participation in track and trace program required by the County.

Provision of written consent to reasonable on-site compliance inspections.

Agreement to indemnify and hold harmless the County of Yolo.

Those owning, leasing, occupying or having charge of the property who have been convicted of certain felonies in any jurisdiction are prohibited from cultivating medical marijuana in Yolo County.

Are there limitations on the location of medical marijuana cultivation?

Cultivation, in any amount, is not allowed:

- Outdoors, within 1,000 feet of a youth-oriented facility, school, school bus stop, park, church or tribal lands.
- Outdoors, within 75 feet of any occupied legal residential structure located on a separate parcel.
- In any location not fully enclosed by an opaque fence at least 6 feet in height. The fence must be adequately secured by a locked gate and evidence of cultivation shall not be visible from a public right-of-way or publicly traveled private roads.

Are there residency requirements?

Whether by patient qualification or permit, those cultivating medical marijuana must own the premises or have entered into a written lease with and have obtained written permission (including notarized signatures) from the property owner.

What is the maximum grow size allowed in Yolo County?

Outdoor grows can be up to 43,560 square feet per parcel.

What are the requirements and restrictions on the cultivation of medical marijuana?

Note: Greenhouses are considered to be outdoors and medical marijuana cultivation is not considered to be "ag exempt".

Requirements and restrictions on the cultivation of medical marijuana include:

The use of light assistance for outdoor cultivation shall not exceed a maximum of 600 watts of lighting capacity per 100 square feet of growing area.

All lights shall be shielded and downcast or otherwise positioned in a manner that will not shine light or allow light glare to exceed the

boundaries of the parcel upon which they are placed.

Cultivation shall not utilize water illegally diverted from any stream, creek, river, ditch or other body/source of water.

All buildings in which marijuana is stored shall be properly secured.

Registration with the Yolo County Department of Agriculture is required.

What does the requirement of registering with the Yolo County Department of Agriculture entail?

Within 60 days of adoption of the ordinance related to cultivation of medical marijuana (adopted Nov. 22, 2016), or prior to commencing cultivation, entities commercially cultivating medical marijuana within the unincorporated area of Yolo County must apply for a business license from the Yolo County Department of Community Services, and pay applicable fees.

Are there fees related to the cultivation of medical marijuana?

Yes. Below are the current fees charged to cover the costs associated with the regulation of commercial medical marijuana cultivation:

\$1,500 per Application Fee

- Covers costs associated with receiving and processing applications for commercial cultivation permits

\$7,600 Initial Permit Fee

- Covers costs associated with initial issuance of commercial cultivation permit
- Includes full initial site inspection, site and zoning clearance, initial testing of product type
- Includes initial case establishment, inspection documentation and site inclusion on County GIS

\$1.60 per sq. ft. (CBD Dominant) / \$2.48 per sq. ft. (THC Dominant) Annual Certification Fees

- Covers costs associated with track & trace program to monitor produce yields
- Different fees depending on whether product is CBD or THC dominant as THC dominant strains have higher "street" value and public safety risk, requiring additional time and resources

\$142 Hourly Enforcement Fee

- Covers costs to inspect non-permitted, non-compliant and non-responsive sites
- Calculated for all hours of effort required until cultivator complies with permitting process

Can an existing licensed Yolo County cultivator add additional cultivation sites?

Additional sites can be added under an existing California Regional

Water Quality Control Board (CVRWQCB) Central Valley Region Notice of Intent/Notice of Application (NOI/NOA). Sites requiring a new CVRWQCB NOI/NOA would not qualify.

Is cannabis considered an agricultural crop in California?

California defines medical cannabis as an agricultural product. The identification as an agricultural crop, however, does not extend to other areas of the law. For example, marijuana is not an agricultural crop with respect to local "right to farm" ordinances.

Can I commercially cultivate non-medical marijuana in Yolo County?

No.

What other laws apply to cultivation of medical marijuana in the unincorporated areas of Yolo County?

Cultivators in Yolo County must comply with all applicable state and federal laws, including the California Attorney General's 2008 Guidelines for Security and Non-Diversion of Marijuana Grown for Medical Use.

Are Yolo County's marijuana regulations permanent?

Yolo County's present marijuana regulations will be in place until the Board of Supervisors takes further action to change them. However, the County of Yolo intends to continue review and consideration of a more comprehensive medical marijuana licensing and regulatory program and to consider developing revised regulations that most effectively regulate and license all facets of marijuana activities. The intent is to develop permanent policy and regulations related to marijuana before the State begins issuing licenses in early 2018.

Can I use or cultivate non-medical marijuana?

Subject to all applicable restrictions contained in Proposition 64, an adult 21 years or older may grow up to 6 plants and use non-medical marijuana inside their own residence.

Can I engage in commercial activities involving non-medical marijuana?

No. Non-medical marijuana commercial activities are illegal until the State begins issuing licenses to operators in early 2018. Additionally, the Yolo County Board of Supervisors took preliminary steps to also prohibit non-medical marijuana commercial activities in the unincorporated area of Yolo County at its meeting on Jan. 24, 2017. The Board will consider adopting that ban at its meeting on Feb. 7, 2017.

First 5 Yolo Invests in Youngest Children and Families

First 5 Yolo released an annual Local Evaluation Report showing the impact of approximately \$1.6 million of investments in programs and services for children prenatal to 5 years and their families in Yolo County during Fiscal Year 2015-2016. Funded programs served 3,650 participants county-wide, including children, families/caregivers, and providers across four priority areas: Improved Child Health, Improved Child Development, Improved Family Functioning, and Improved Systems and Networks. Funded programs focused on increasing the number of Yolo County children who are healthy and ready to learn by the time they enter kindergarten. Services strengthened the local foster care system, expanded home visiting services, delivered emergency child care for families in crisis, provided early developmental screenings including early child mental health assistance, offered high quality preschool, and emphasized early learning. Access to early child mental health services, and very early detection and intervention for children 0-5 is an emerging need. First 5 Yolo has launched an ambitious system-wide approach with Help Me Grow, a program administered by Children’s Therapy Center of Northern California in collaboration with Yolo County Children’s Alliance (YCCA), RISE, Inc., and Empower Yolo. Help Me Grow works to increase the number of children 0-5 who are screened for developmental, social emotional, behavioral, and cognitive delays; connects families to services; and identifies and addresses barriers to accessing services. The program has developed cross-sector partnerships with organizations through the County to create a system of early child mental health support, with full launch at the end of FY15/16. In the first year, Help Me Grow provided free screenings to 551 children in Yolo, identifying 21% scoring in the “concern” range in one of more of the assessments. According to First 5 Yolo Commissioner Nichole Arnold, “The identification of possible developmental issues is a first step in early intervention for these children, and will pay dividends down the road in terms of health, education, and future life success.” First 5 Yolo is looking to expand access to developmental screenings and connection to services, and is actively exploring options for leveraging other public and private funds to

sustain and build the program. Several other successful programs and services were funded as well. Yolo County Supervisor and Chair of First 5 Yolo, Jim Provenza, noted, “We are proud of Yolo First 5’s role in helping kids stay healthy, giving families the tools they need to remain safe and stable and providing early learning opportunities for our youngest residents. The evaluation report again validates that we are reaching and supporting many of the most vulnerable children in our community.” Other key funded programs and partners included: Safe respite care and wrap-around services for families in crisis (Yolo Crisis Nursery) Evidence-based home visitation program for expectant parents (County of Yolo Health and Human Services and Yolo County Children’s Alliance Step by Step/ Paso a Paso) Parenting Classes for children and parents (RISE, Inc. Avance) Peer-led parenting support networks (Family Hui) Play School Experience early learning and parent support (YCCA, RISE, Empower Yolo) Enhancing early learning and literacy (Yolo County Library Storytime, Winters BOOST, and ARK Preschool) Quality improvement for early childhood providers (First 5 IMPACT and City of West Sacramento’s Up4WS) Foster Care Recruitment and Retention (YCCA)

Looking forward, First 5 Yolo is focused on improving systems that serve Yolo County’s youngest children and their families. According to First 5 Yolo Executive Director Gina Daleiden, “First 5 Yolo is committed to investing strategically in programs, services, and systems, and to devoting agency resources to support early prevention and intervention efforts with other organizations, funders, and key stakeholders. Together, we can have the greatest impact.” Harder+Company’s work reflects data gathered through reporting to First 5 Yolo, as well as additional evaluation efforts conducted by staff and Harder+Company.
